

Ancient Greece Travel Brochure Project

For this project, you will be creating a travel brochure for the Ancient Greek civilization. Most of the information, you should have learned or will continue learning during our class discussions and activities. However, you will also need to research information about the land itself, the weather, the climate, travel and any points of interest that existed during this time in Ancient Greece. The task is for you to take the information that you have gathered and create a *Travel Brochure* for someone who is interested in visiting Ancient Greece. The Travel Brochure should advertise this part of the ancient world and grab your “tourists” attention! For each section of the Brochure, use the research data you have gathered. Remember, this is an end of unit assessment. But, be sure to have fun with the project and let your imagination soar! This is the time to show what you know and make the reader want to visit Ancient Greece. **PROJECTS ARE DUE 04/12/19.**

There are four (4) parts to this assignment. You will submit your research data AND the brochure. Your research data means (1) your original notes used, (2) your outline for the information and (3) your rough draft. The brochure will be your (4) final project and MUST include all of the following categories:

(Front Cover)

- Title with short introduction explaining the importance of Ancient Greece civilization.

(Inside page 1)

- Physical description of the area (Where is this place? What is the land like?)
- Weather/Climate conditions

(Inside center page)

- Points of interest (What is there to see and do?)
- Theatre (Difference between Tragedy and Comedy)

(Inside last page)

- Important elements of Ancient Greek history
- Important People

(Outside back page)

- Legacies of Ancient Greece (influences on things we still used today)
- Your name, date, class block

Remember that in order to make your brochure interesting you may want to use various text fonts, styles, and illustrations throughout your brochure. Remember that all work on your brochure should be original so even your information should be in your own words. **Your name and class period should be on the back on your brochure- not on the title page.**
